On Sunday 27th April John Rainey, presented the following Offertory address:

"The following quote is from Matthew 25 'For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me.'

Many of you will be aware that when I first attended this Church I was homeless living either on the street or in overnight shelters. Your sign –Coffee with the Parson drew me in. It is difficult for anyone, who has not lived a life on the street, to conceive of the discomforts, humiliations and indeed dangers that are faced on a day to day basis by people living this way.

All that changed for me the day I walked into this Church. You fed me for a start and later you clothed me and a Church member took me in. Now I have a job at the Church. You cannot begin to know how grateful I am for how my life has changed. I am now in a position to help you help those still living the homeless life. The clothes closet has been a blessing to both my friends and me,

Last year, I had the chance to assist Linda Johnson, produce our Community Service Booklet which lets those in need know where help is available through clothing closets and food banks and this year I was invited to join the committee which organizes our new Back-pack ministry for the homeless. As you know each back-pack contains food, water, clothing and toiletries together with other things to make life that bit easier to those in need. The difficulty with this ministry will always be distribution. Some members of the Church carry one or two packs in their cars for when the opportunity arises. Packs are kept at the Church to be handed to those in need. So far 7 packs have been given away. This offertory request is not only that you give generously to this Church, that in turn gives so much to others, but that you also give to our back-pack ministry ably led by Micki Artman and Debra Goodnight."

Visitors and New Members

We were so honored, in April, by the number of visitors we have had particularly for our Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday Services.

But we were also blessed on Easter Sunday by Jennifer Stevens coming forward, during our hymn of decision, to confirm her Christian beliefs and to become a member of our Church. The following is a summary of the Meeting of the General board held, following our Church Service, on Sunday April 13th. The full minutes will be presented at the next Board Meeting.

The meeting opened with prayer at 12:35pm and the minutes of the previous meeting were approved .

Pastor's Report: Bill Russell expressed appreciation to the guest speakers who occupied the pulpit and led Bible classes while he was away and also thanked Floyd and Carol Scarberry for opening up their lake house for the Men's Retreat earlier in the month.

Treasurer: Mark Rutledge gave the treasurer's report which indicated an income of \$8982 against expenses of \$9144 resulting in a small shortfall of \$162.

DWM: Linda Johnson indicated that the dates of June 14 and 21 have been selected as the dates for the Summer Sale and half-price sale.

Building and Grounds: Floyd Scarberry reported various repairs having been completed but that windows need replacing on the 4th floor of the Education Building and that the roof of the Gymnasium building needs patching, Estimates for this work have been requested.

Outreach: Debra Goodnight reported on the Easter Week of Compassion Offering and on foods and needed items delivered to Grace St. Luke's Food Pantry. The next collection for the Food Pantry would be the month of June. She also reported on the Back Pack Ministry in that, to date ,7 back packs have been produced.

Evangelism: Pastor Bill Russell thanked Mark Rutledge for his creative plans and Carol Scarberry and John Rainey in organizing the Easter Egg Hunt.

Calling: Carol Scarberry reported on visits, cards, phone calls etc. to those of the congregation who are sick or who are shut-in.

Communication: George Goodnight reported that the church has a new website and new site administrator. **Weddings**: Connie Bennett reported on the progress with the wedding chapel particularly the seating.

Facilities Usage: Mark Rutledge reported on various events to be held before the next board meeting including the African Violet Society annual sale, the Community Easter Egg Hunt and the Memphis Camerata Ensemble who will hold a concert at 4:00 PM on May 18, 2014, and all are invited all to attend.

Young Adults' Program: Wesley Goodnight proposed Young Adult Group Meetings and John Bennett, as Board Chair, appointed Wesley as Chairman over committee to determine feasibility of the program. Pastor Bill Russell offered his assistance.

The goal of Rachel's Kids Inc. is to provide opportunities and improved quality of life for these children who live in the inner city neighborhoods of Mamphis. The sole focus of our effort is directed towards the children of the Binghampton section name Midtown Memphis.

A secondary goal is to develop professional, effective, and innovative grassroots philanthropic leadership around the city. We have gone beyond saying 'love your neighbor", we have found a way to show them. Rachel's Kids has embraced the vision of former Secretary of State, Colin Powell, who expresses our vision "that every kid needs a relationship with a caring adult, safe places to meet, a healthy start, a place to develop marketable skills, and an opportunity to save others".

Rachel's Kids sends up to 60 children to camp each summer. The cost per child ranges from \$130.00 for a local day camp to \$500.00 for a week long camping experience. The families are seldom

equipped to provide the children with all the supplies they need, especially if they are attending a week long outing. You can help a child make a life time memory by providing any of the items listed below or you can sponsor a child with the registration fee to attend one of these camps.
