Spotlight on Giving

On Sunday, September 20th, immediately after the Baptism of Bridget Sharp (see page 4), John Bennett brought us the following offertory thought:

Brian D. McLaren, a former Pastor and Author of "More of Ready Than You Realize" said, and I quote "Baptism is rich in meaning. It suggests cleansing. When you are a disciple, you understand that you are cleansed by Christ. You understand that Christ died in your place on the cross, paying for your sins, fully forgiving you for all your wrongs. You are cleansed from guilt, and you are becoming a cleaner, healthier, more whole person."

Bridgett has shown, by her acceptance of baptism, her total commitment not only to our church but to the creed that we espouse each week: "I believe that Jesus is the Christ, the son of the living God, and I accept him as my Lord and Savior.

Now let's turn our attention to the concept of commitment. We have all heard the adage that the difference between commitment and involvement is akin to having bacon and eggs on your plate in the morning. That is, the pig is committed but the chicken is merely involved. But is that a good analogy when related to ones Church life.

The pig is dragged squealing and kicking to the butcher to provide bacon and sausages but then he drops out of the picture. A one hit wonder if you will. Commitment is long term. Now contrast the chicken. Born to lay eggs, knows nothing else but to lay eggs, throughout it's life, while able to do so, continues to lay eggs. Now that's commitment.

The chicken, like the good Church goer, is not looking to get something from the Church but is continually giving of her resources. To paraphrase an American President, "ask not what your Church can do for you but what can you do for your Church".

When we try to analyze what we can give back it is as well to read the works of the great English philosopher Lord Bertrand Russel who wrote "The most valuable things in life are not measured in monetary terms. The really important things are not houses and lands, stocks and bonds, automobiles and real state, but friendships, trust, confidence, empathy, mercy, love and faith".

Quite honestly I believe that I am wasting my time with an offertory homily. Those of you who donate or tithe by mail or bank draft have done so, others are already sitting there with their offertory envelopes clasped in their hands waiting for the deacons to come round. The only way I will know if what I have said is having any effect is if there is a sudden rustling of hands in pockets or handbags to pull out a further \$1,\$5,\$10 etc. to add to their already generous giving....pause... now that's what I like to hear!

She was taught the power of prayer by her parents, Artis and Birder Sharp, and attended Zion Temple Church of God in Christ as a child. As she matured, she realized her passion for science and helping others which ultimately led her to make the decision to attend Christian Brothers University. Bridgett majored in biology in hopes of one day working in the medical field as a nurse, but God had other plans in store for her. Nearing her final year of college, she was given the pleasure to work at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital as a student worker and shortly after graduating she was given a full time position as a research technologist in the Infectious Diseases department where she currently works. There, she focuses primarily on influenza

and astrovirus research in hopes of giving immunocompromised children a fighting chance against these viruses. Despite finding her true calling in life, she still felt a deep void. She came to realize that her roots in the church had been broken over the years and was looking for a church she could call "home". That's when God did another miraculous thing for her. He introduced Bridgett to Central Christian Church via her friend, Michael Glenn Simmons. After witnessing Michael's baptism and experiencing the love and warmth the church had to offer, she knew right away she'd found her "home".
