Spotlight on Giving

On Sunday January 24th Daphne Brown delivered the following offertory message on behalf of Carol Scarberry. It is entitled "Never Let Go":

"Discouraged by his 10 years of defeat in his efforts to end slavery, William Wilberforce (see below), who became a politician in 1780 and an evangelical Christian in 1785 was distressed and disheartened. One day he opened his Bible to seek uplifting and understanding. A piece of paper fell out. It was a letter from the famous Methodist Minister, John Wesley. Wesley's words were challenging and powerful.'

"He wrote "unless the divine power has raised you up, I see not how you can go through your glorious enterprise in opposing that abominable practice of slavery unless God has raised you up for this very thing, you will be worn out by the opposition of men and devils. But if God be for you, who can be against you. Are all of them together stronger than God. Go on in the name of God and in the power of His might."

"It took Wilberforce 20 years to see slavery abolished in England. So how does John Wesley's message apply to us at Central? Carol said that when we went through the New Beginnings Evaluation, she felt like giving up then she felt courage enough to help make things change. When we start a project that takes time, hard work and financial resources, we meet opposition and grow weary. We have so much to offer and to share in this church ... yet our membership isn't where we want it and we become discouraged. 'But if God be for us, who can be against us?' Let us now give back to God's church and Never Let Go."

William Wilberforce 1758 to 1833

A native of Kingston upon Hull, Yorkshire, in England, he began his political career in 1780, eventually becoming the Member of Parliament for Yorkshire (1784-1812). In 1785, he became an Evangelical Christian and in 1787, met Thomas Clarkson and a group of anti-slave-trade activists, including Granville Sharp, Hannah More and Charles Middleton. They persuaded Wilberforce to take on the cause of abolition, and he soon became one of the leading English abolitionists. He headed the parliamentary campaign against the British slave trade for twenty years until the passage of the Slave Trade Act of 1807. He also championed causes such as the foundation of the Church Mission Society, and the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

Church Door Ministry

Our Church Door Ministry continues to provide snack bags, sandwiches, fruit drinks and water to homeless and others in need who come to our Church door. We also hand out vouchers for an overnight stay and meal at the Memphis Union Mission.
