## BUILDING from the BOARD

### Highlights from the July 20, 2012 Board Meeting are as follows:

Expenses include replacement of the air-conditioning unit in Fellowship Hall and replacement of the roof.

The DWM approved \$750 to paint and install laminated flooring in the parlor. Additional improvements are planned, such as recovering the Duncan Phyfe Sofa, recovering the straight chair seats and new window treatments.

The Board approved the DWM's request to host a Clothes Closet one Saturday per month.

The Membership Department took over the 5th Sunday Food Drive for Grace St. Luke's Food Pantry that was formerly coordinated by Gloria Jeffrey.

The beautiful Bible Commentary, purchased for Bill Russell's installation, was received and presented to him. He was so pleased by the presentation and expressed heart-felt appreciation.

The small group leaders will meet in early August to discuss format for small group congregational meetings, as recommended by New Beginnings, to determine the future direction for our church.

Cakes and baked goods are requested for the August 2nd Election Day.

The committee appointed as a liaison between the Board and the Minister has been broadened, at the Minister's request, to include the congregation and staff. Herb Butts, Floyd Scarberry, and Kathy Young serve on the Committee and are available should there be a need.

## **NEW PASTOR AN OLD FRIEND AT MIDTOWN MEMPHIS CHURCH**

Central Christian Church's blue neon cross has been beckoning Bill Russell for decades. He grew up two blocks from the Midtown church at the corner of Peabody and McLean.

He was in the Cub Scouts at Central. He was baptized by the late Rev. Charles Woodall, who was Central's pastor for 24 years.

His mother was Central's pianist for many years, his aunt was organist and choir director. Now, his daughter, Amy, is the congregation's pianist and choir director. Ironically, Russell, who has been a bi-vocational minister since the 1970s, was never a member at Central.

That will change Sunday when Russell, 63, is installed at Central's new pastor.

"This really is like coming home," said Russell, who owns Russell Brothers Fine Jewelers.

Russell succeeds Scott Pricer, who left in December to become pastor of Faith Christian Church. Pricer followed Woodall.

Russell has served seven congregations over the past 40 years as a minister of youth, music or evangelism. This will be his first assignment as pastor.

"My hope for Central is that it can continue to have a vital ministry in the Midtown area and be a vibrant place of worship for those in Central Gardens," Russell said.

Russell's wife, Anne, is organist at Kingsway Christian Church. They've been married for 44 years and have four children and eight grandchildren. Two of his children are members at Central.

"Never let your children give you your e-mail address and set it up for you," said Russell, whose e-mail address is amoron@gmail.com.

"That said, over the years I have really grown to appreciate the fact that when people type it in or it shows up in their in-box, it puts a smile on their face. And it is easy to remember."


