January 6th The Feast Day of Epiphany

Epiphany, on January 6th, is celebrated on the day following the twelve days of Christmas. While, in the U.S., the tree and other decoration are usually put up just after Thanksgiving and taken down on December 26th, in most countries of Europe the decorations stay up for the full twelve days.

The Feast Day of Epiphany recognizes the coming of the Wise Men from the East who followed the Bethlehem Star to bring, the baby Jesus, gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh. Little is known of these Wise Men. Were there three of them? The Gospels don't say how many. In legend, they have been named as the Magi of Bethlehem, Balthazar of Arabia, Melchior of Persia and Gaspar of India. In addition they have been upgraded to Kings!

They are last heard of in the Gospels returning to the East by a different route so as to avoid being questioned by Herod as to the whereabouts of Jesus.

New Year's Reflection by Dr. Sharon Watkins, General Minister & President Disciples of Christ

The following are extracts from a New Years letter written by Dr. Sharon Watkins.

There is a growing conviction that now is the time to move forward to embrace a renewed sense of mission outside church walls.

In this new season of mission and new life, a realistic look at who we are helps us organize to fulfill a mission appropriate to our size and resources. It's also a call to each congregation to actively seek God's transforming power to be and to share the Good News of Jesus Christ right where we are.

Now is the time to reset ourselves for mission- grateful for who we are and who we have been - so that this movement for wholeness can move. As we go, our memories go with us. They can serve as fuel - evidence of a time when we were protected against the storm - or they can slow us down - points of reference that cause us to look backward when we need to orient ourselves to the future where God is calling us now.

As we enter this new season, made strong by where we have been, grateful that God still calls us forward, may we lean on God's presence for inspiration and strength. Lord, teach us to pray as you call us forward into mission again.

Congratulations to Rachel Greer



The Commercial Appeal Newspaper have published a list of the twelve people who, in their view, have made the biggest contribution in the past year, of their time and energy, to make the City of Memphis a better place. We are so pleased to see our own Rachel Greer is among those honored, for her work with Rachel's Kids, an organization so close to our hearts. The citation is as follows:

Accomplishment: Rachel Coats, co-owner of Rachel's Flowers and Gifts, and her longtime boyfriend, Harry Greer, combined forces in the late 1990s to help children in the Binghamton neighborhood. They started a non-profit group, Rachel's Kids, which organized camping trips, church camps, trips to Grizzlies and Memphis Tigers basketball games and the circus. They helped organize tutoring, bought school uniforms, food and Christmas presents. Rachel and Harry married before his death on the day after Christmas last year. Together they had begun a reindeer project last year, helping children learn to make reindeer of logs, twigs and sticks with bows and ornaments which the children sold through the flower shop with 100 percent of proceeds going to the children. The idea took hold this year with major orders and total sales of more than 500 large and small reindeer.

Background: Rachel already had won a Jefferson Award for tireless work on behalf of children in the Binghamton area. Her enthusiasm has attracted dozens of volunteers, churches and contributors to Rachel's Kids.

Quote: "The kids had joy in creating each one of these reindeer, and the adults who bought them each experienced the joy of Christmas in their own way. The project has produced so much joy and goodwill. The spirit of Harry

Greer is definitely living on."
