- Collected Easter clothes for Church Women United & cold/flu medicines for the Compassion Clinic and Rachel's Kids
- Completed a Wedding Brochure to advertise Central as a beautiful location for weddings
- Complete a Community Resources booklet to assist with providing resources to those in need
- Continued several months of the new program in the Sanctuary, 'Coffee with the Parson'
- Celebrated the 1st year anniversary of Bill Russell's leadership as our Minister

The DWM collected and delivered gift bags to the women at Carat Place, gifts to the shut-ins, and cold medicine for Rachel's Kids during the month of December.

**Kitchen Closing:** The kitchen will be closed January 1-15, 2014 for pest control, deep cleaning and general improvements to the kitchen.

An "Un-decorating Party" is scheduled for Saturday, January 4, 2014 at 9:00 AM to remove, pack and store all Christmas decorations.

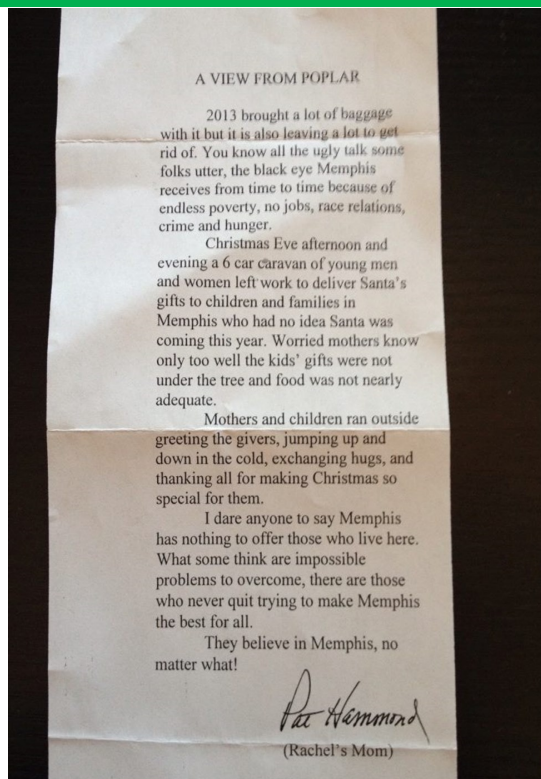

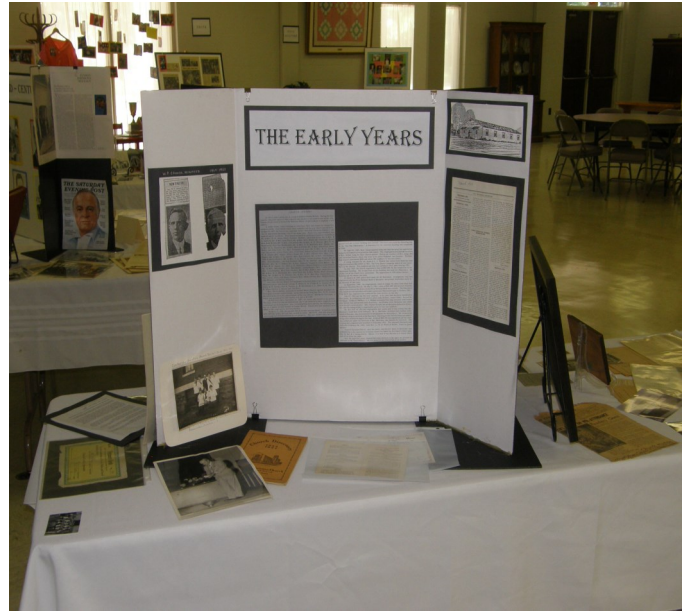


## May

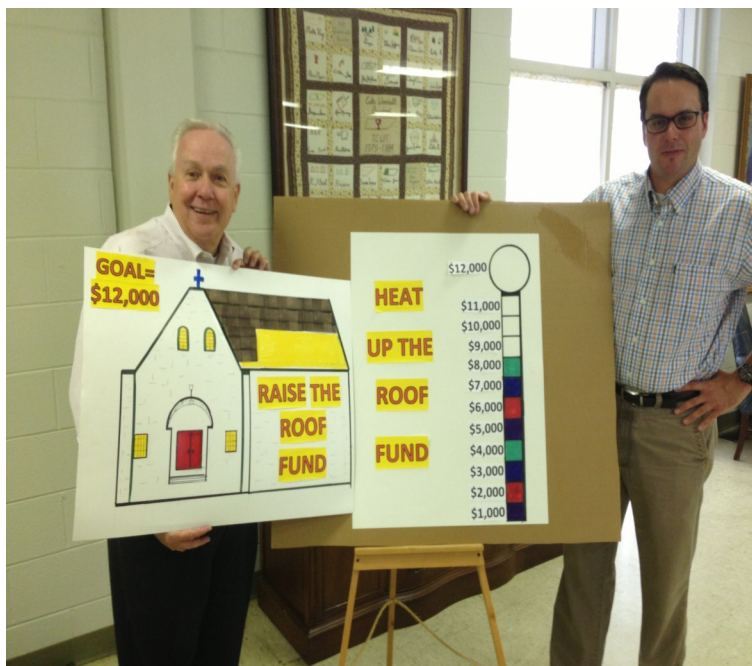
## August
