The New Beginnings Small Group Discussions, led and moderated by Debra Goodnight, were a great success. The recommendations resulting from those discussions will be compiled into a report and presented at the next Board Meeting.

Redecoration of the parlor is almost completed

The DWM approved \$185 expense to purchase reusable signage to announce the Autumn Evening Event.

Bids for Lighting in the Sanctuary and landscape design in Penny's Chapel Gardens have been submitted for completion upon availability of funds or receipt of designated donations

Two positive staffing changes have occurred, with John Bennett assuming Patty Quinn's position as Administrative Assistant and Dorian Lyons filling John Bennett's position as Custodian.

The Bake sale is scheduled for Autumn Evenings and everyone was encouraged to bring in their baked goods.

The first two Wednesday Night Family Dinners in October will be canceled and used for work nights for the Autumn Evening Event.

Title: Genesis 1:3 "Let there be 'better' light!"

When we worship on Sunday morning, have you noticed that the lighting is not quite bright enough to read the bulletin or the hymnal? Of course you have! Does the sanctuary seem somewhat dark when you enter? No doubt about it!

The Building and Grounds Committee, Pastor Bill Russell, and George Goodnight have met with several electricians to see what, if anything, could be done to improve the lighting. I am happy to say that with the help of Bill's contacts, a bid has been received to "re socket" the 12 chandeliers in the sanctuary. The current wiring was installed during the late 1940's when the sanctuary was built. It definitely needs replacement before modern lighting can be installed

The bid of \$2000 includes "re socketing", installing the correct light bulbs, and also replacing a spot light on the first arch nearest the front of the church. The total time to complete the project is one day. The work has been approved by the Board and is about \$1,800 less than what we expected. Now that's a bargain! In addition, the Disciple Women's Ministry is donating \$1,000 to help offset the cost. Hopefully by mid November we will have the additional donated funds to complete this project.


Several changes are in the works at our church, both inside and outside. On the outside you have already seen "Penny's Playground" changing into "Penny's Chapel Garden". Big changes are on the way!

The Buildings and Grounds Committee has met with the landscaper from Evergreen Earthcare design and develop this project. The goal is to transform the area to a place where anyone may come to sit, meditate, and enjoy peaceful, beautiful surroundings. Hopefully this area will be used also for outside events, such as small weddings or even worship services.

The cost for the new Chapel Garden will be \$7,500, which is not cheap. The cost is about half of what we might expect. Once the project is complete, it will be one of quality, and well worth the price. Evergreen Earthcare is also willing to work with us on a payment schedule and, if necessary, to complete the project in phases as resources are available.

Since the project has begun, \$250, \$500, and \$1,000 donations have been given to the "Chapel Garden". The donations include memorials and honorariums to friends and members of Central Christian. We're just about a third of the way there, but I believe that we can make this goal over the next two to three years.

Clothes Closet


