



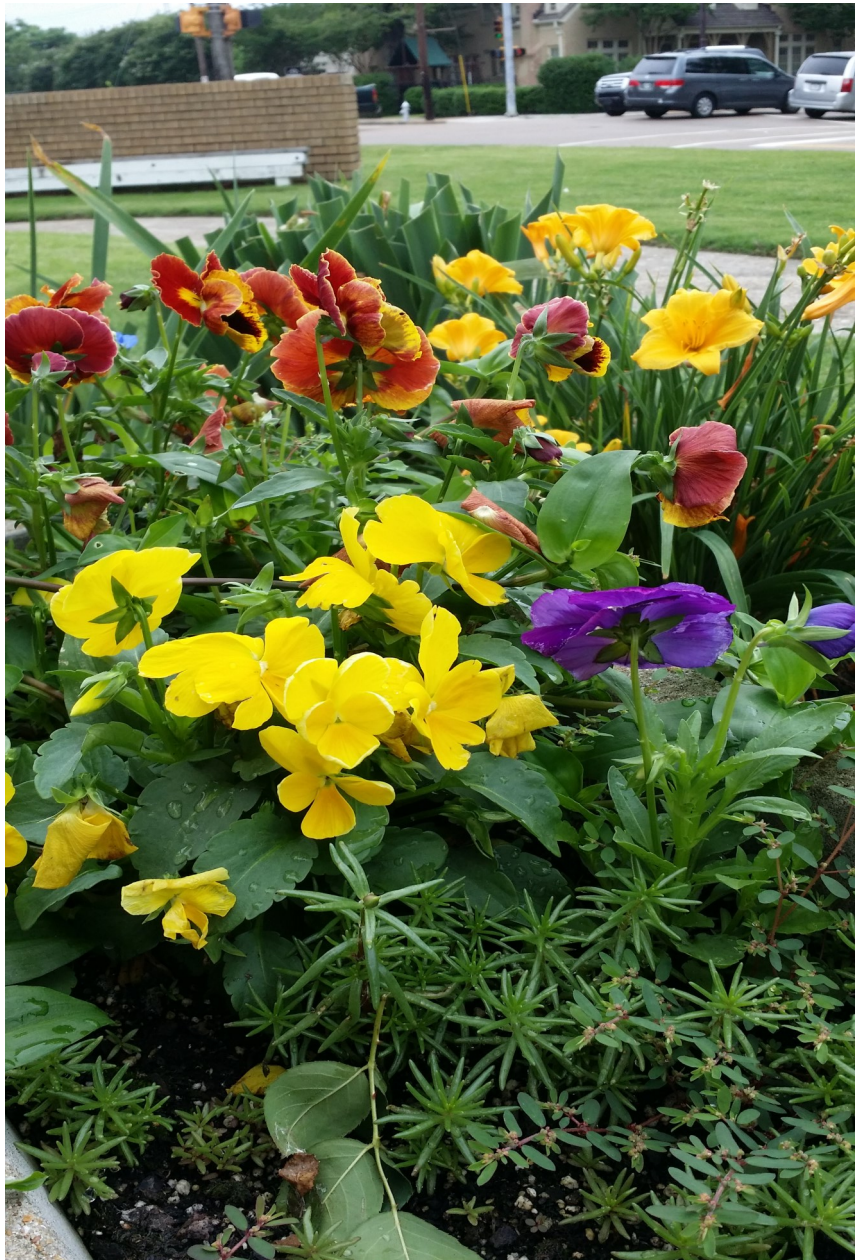

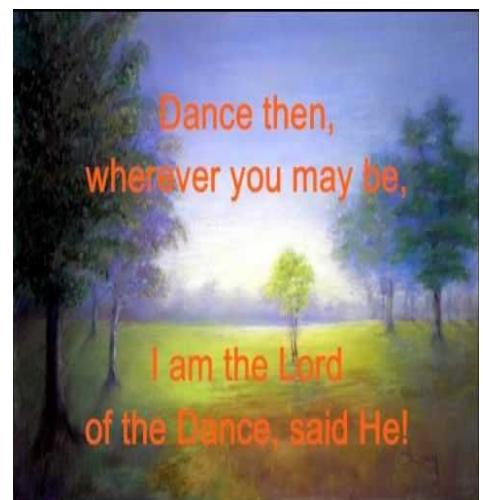
## Congratulations

# DWM

A previous edition of the Banner included the incredible list of programs supported by our DWM (Disciples Women's Ministries). During our preparations for the Summer Sale, and indeed for the Autumn evening which is not that far away, it is appropriate that we remind ourselves what this fund raising is all for. Here, in summary, are the Charities and organization supported DWM through our fund raising efforts:

## **American Leprosy Program**

**Church Health Center:** The Church Health Center seeks to reclaim the Church's biblical commitment to care for our bodies and our spirits. Their ministries provide healthcare for the working uninsured and promote healthy bodies and spirits for all.

**Karat Place:** Founded in 1999 by Melvena Leake, Karat Place is a grassroots non-profit residential rehabilitation program for homeless women ex-offenders and their children

**Meal Card and Snack Pack Project:** The Disciple Women purchase gift cards in small denominations from a fast food restaurant that is within walking distance of the church to be given out to people who come to our doors and are hungry. They also contribute toward snack packs and vouchers for the Union Mission which are also handed out to the homeless you visit our Church doors.

**Memphis Union Mission:** Memphis Union Mission ministers to the physical, spiritual, and emotional needs of men, women and children who are homeless, addicted, and in crisis.

**MIFA (Memphis Inter-Faith Association):** The mission of MIFA is to support the independence of vulnerable seniors and families in crisis through high-impact programs.

**Minister's Discretionary Fund:** Central has traditionally kept a small discretionary fund, distributed by the Minister, to be used to assist members and friends of the church in emergency situations, such as lack of utilities.

**Neighborhood Compassion Clinic:** Established by Dr. John Lang and his wife Judy, a registered nurse, NCC is located in the Binghampton area of Memphis. They are open one evening a week and serve patients from infants to senior citizens. They treat diabetes, hypertension, colds, flu and any other ailment that is presented to them. The clinic is funded entirely through donations from friends, family and local church groups.

**Rachel's Kids:** The goal of Rachel's Kids Inc. is to provide opportunities and improved quality of life for those children who live in the inner city neighborhoods of Memphis.

**Woman to Woman Global -Woman-to-Woman Worldwide (WWW)** is sponsored by the International DWM and administered by the staff of Disciples Women in conjunction with Global Ministries.

## Building from the Board

Our Meeting of the General board was held on May 21st. The treasurer, John Bennett, reported that while a surplus was achieved in April of \$2875 this was largely due to a generous donation by a member of the Church to cover the costs of repairs to woodwork in the Education Building. However he was pleased to report that so far this year we are in surplus as against our predicted budget shortfall and that we have good cash reserves. Among other matters discussed and/or voted on were plans for the Summer Sale, a new hymn of the month during the Summer and the reinstatement of Coffee in the Narthex while the Fellowship Hall is unavailable. Our next Board Meeting will be on June 25th.
