### Spotlight on Giving

At our Independence Day Service on July 5th, John Bennett, our documented foreign worker, gave the following Offertory homily:

"There is an mathematical field of study known as Chaos theory. The most famous example of this theory is that the details of a hurricane (exact time of formation, exact path taken) can be influenced by such minor matters as the flapping of the wings of a distant butterfly several weeks earlier.

For example: 'The British are coming' so said Paul Revere, an American silversmith, engraver, early industrialist, and a patriot in the American Revolution. He is best known for alerting the Colonial militia to the approach of British forces before the battles of Lexington and Concord. These words were allegedly spoken on the night of April 17th, 1775, just before the first shots of the Revolutionary War which led to this country's Independence which was celebrated yesterday. By his own accounts he actually said 'The regulars are coming out' a reference to the militia. His was a small contribution to the war effort, in fact, on that fateful night 40 other riders were out giving the same message. Consider the incredible influence of his small contribution, a contribution not mentioned in his obituary but after being immortalized in Henry Wadsworth Longfellow's poem, 'Paul Revere's Ride', gave rise to a rallying cry for American Patriotism

'So what has this to do with the offertory. Well, my theme is "small beginnings". Cast your minds back to that meeting in 1923 when a small group of people got together to found the East End Church now Central Christian Church. We all know the achievements of this Church and while we are presently small in number we know those founding members would appreciate what we do.'

So if severe weather can be influenced by a butterfly and world events can be influenced by the shouting of Paul Revere a silversmith with 16 children, then what difference can your contribution, however small or large, make to this Church and the work that we do in this community."
