A Letter of Appreciation from John and Judy Lang to the members of Central Christian Church



The pandemic and the public health emergency caused by the COVID-19 virus have taken a severe toll on our operations and Compassion Neighborhood Clinic (CNC). The present situation has made it impossible to safeguard the health and well-being of our patients, our volunteer staff, and your beautiful church. The risks have become too great and we cannot in good conscience continue to operate with the potential to spread the COVID-19 virus to the very people we have come to love and cherish.

After much prayer, deliberation, consultation, and soul-searching, our board of directors recently unanimously voted to dissolve the organization, determining this path was the wise and prudent option among the many options considered. So, after eleven and a half years of operation, Compassion Neighborhood Clinic is closing.

We owe a special debt of gratitude to the members of Central Christian Church for their support, friendship, encouragement, leadership, and mentorship. You have led by example and taught us how to truly love God and love others. From the time we first stepped into Central Christian Church with Harry and Rachel, we were welcomed and loved by your congregation. We had no idea that when we read an article about Rachel's Kids, that we would embark on a journey that would bring so many wonderful people into our life. This entire congregation has taught us how to live out the scripture in Matthew 25 when Jesus says: 'Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me.' Never have we seen such a collection of folks who were more hard working, loving and inclusive. You worked tirelessly to support our efforts with finances, medications and fundraisers. You have taught us what it truly means to be God's hands and feet and for all your love we are deeply grateful. Closing the clinic was a hard decision especially because all of you have believed in us and supported us wholeheartedly for so long.

We have grown so much from what has gone on at CNC. We have met wonderful people who have come alongside to serve with us and support us. And we now know wonderful families and people who first came to us as patients but are now considered friends, neighbors, and extended family. We have often heard comments and feedback about our hard work, dedication, and sacrifice but the honest truth is that the clinic is not now and never was about us at all. We were truly humbled by this experience. We have come to appreciate the fact that this clinic was in reality the Lord's invitation to get to know Him better and to know His saints better as well. We have received many times more blessings than we pretend to give, which leads me to steal a line from one of my most beloved mentors, Harry Greer when interviewed by a reporter from the Commercial Appeal some 20 years ago. Harry was asked about all the kids he was helping and he simply stated this about his experience, "We are the lucky ones". He was right. Judy and I have embraced his attitude and are deeply grateful to God and to you all for enriching our lives and helping us grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord.
