With Sympathy



Conference call discussed the pros and cons for the reopening, including steps needed to ensure personal safety of the worshipers.


A <u>draft</u> outline of safety procedures we will need to follow in the Sanctuary will be sent to Central's families in early November.


FILL THE BASKETS!
