In the works: Outside Repairs

Central Christian was gifted with another oppor tunity to test its resolve when disaster happens. Christmas Eve evening 2022 found the church with a broken water pipe that runs through the ceiling along the walkway near the back parking lot. MLG&W was called around 7:30 p.m. Christmas, but, because of the backlog, the crew could not help out until the next morning.

Fortunately workers from National Plumbing put Central on top of their list and arrived early Monday morning to repair the leak. The upper left photo shows the technician inspecting the water leak and the middle photo pieces of the broken pipe. The problem area is now repaired and covered with insulation, but no ceiling tiles just yet.



The new insulation could be damaged by wind and rain. John Rainey used some old voting signs to cover the insulation until new ceiling tiles could be installed (see left photo below). Lower right photo shows work replacing ceiling tiles.

The Sanctuary walls and the Peabody entrance walls have been repaired, but they still need painting. Several contractor bids have been obtained as reported in the January issue of the *Banner*. The cost will be \$7,250. At this time, that amount is not covered in the 2023 church Budget. However, donations of \$1730+ have been pledged to get the job done. Hopefully Central Christian Church will have sufficient funds to cover the cost of the project before the 100th Year Celebration in May.
