#### **More Repairs**

In the May issue of the *Banner* I wrote about repairs that were done around the church, especially the broken outside water pipe and the new "booster heater" that replaced the rusted-out hot water tank. I also mentioned about the need to replace (not patch!) the gym roof as well as replacing two old, non-working A/C units with a new A/C. As mentioned in the article, estimates are being sought for these needed repairs.

#### And the Sanctuary?

With Wesley Goodnight's help, estimates are being sought, also, for fixing the leaks in the Sanctuary. Flat sections along the north and south roofs are causing leaks and damage to the inside of the worship area. Once the roof repairs have been completed, then attention may be paid to repairing and to painting the Sanctuary walls where plaster has flaked off.

#### And the Education Building?

Back in 1923, the Education Building was once the entire church facility: Sanctuary, Fellowship Hall, kitchen, and Sunday School class rooms. The current roof is in need of repairs and needs the old asphalt shingles replaced.

#### **Repairs Time Table**

Repairs throughout the church will probably take several months (years?) to complete. The amount of effort and work to complete the tasks will take time and resources. The Board at Central will soon be meeting to discuss and plan the next move into the needed repairs.

As Chairman of Property and Grounds, I ask that you continue to support our Church (the people) and the church (the buildings) with your prayers and good works so that the Church will remain at the corner of Peabody and McLean for many more years.


