










Message from Rev. Bill Russell

LET THERE BE LIGHT!

Strange things can happen to any church and Central Christian is not immune. Either when the old slate roof was removed or the new shingles installed, two sanctuary lights ceased to work. And it's not what you think! The lights stopped working because they became unplugged from the ceiling (Note: the sanctuary was built in the 1940's).

Tyler and Luke, the crew from Ellendale Electric, came to the rescue. Members of the Property and Grounds Committee did not have the correct ladders and expertise to do what the crew did. The crew arrived and quickly "plugged in" the lights, and also replaced the burned out lights that show on the preacher and worship leader.



In the photo on the left, Luke (in the orange shirt) and Tyler had to remove the pews in order to have enough room to safely climb the extension ladder to change the burned out bulbs as well as to plug in the overhead lights.

Wednesday Night Dinner: *Ufa'* shoulda been there!






