
The photo says it all!. After almost two years, Central was once again able to host a Vegetable Dinner.

Follow Up #1:

The Dish Washer!

In the August issue of the Banner there was an article regarding needed repairs on the 61+ year old dish washer. As promised, here's the follow up.

> Several washing cycles were done to test to see if "plugging the holes" on the iron swivel arm would work. So far, the patches held. However, the rinse cycle still has a lot to be desired.

The rinse cycle worked for plates and eating utensils. Ketchup was smeared on the inside of the glasses, but the rinse cycle did not clean them perfectly. This may have been too hard of a test, since normally glasses are used for tea, water, or other beverage.

The bottom line is that sooner or later the repair will no longer hold, and a new dishwasher will be need-Hopefully that won't be until many months from now.

Aikido Martial Arts



Many of Central's members know that the MidSouth Aikido uses the gym to teach and promote the Japanese martial art Aikido. MidSouth Aikido has been at Central Christian Church

since about May of 2010, and has had an influence not only in Memphis, but throughout the United States.

Aikido is a modern Japanese martial arts that practitioners can use to defend themselves while also protecting their attackers from injury. Aikido is often translated as "the way of unifying life energy" or as "the way of harmonious spirit". According to the founder's philosophy, the primary goal in the practice of aikido is "to overcome oneself instead of cultivating violence or aggressiveness".



Aaron Dale, who leads the "dojo", was recently inducted into the United States Martial Arts Hall of Fame as *Aikido Instructor of the Year* (see photo). The award was presented by the International Martial Arts Council of America.



November 5 - 7, MidSouth Aikido will be hosting a seminar in which martial arts students will be coming to Central from across the country to participate. Andrew Sato Shihan, chief instructor

from the Aikido World Alliance, will be coming to Memphis to instruct and mentor students in the Art of Aikido.





MPD & Aikido? Wow!

Major Roach and 3 precinct officers from the Memphis Police Department (MPD) visited Central to check out the Fellowship Hall and the gym facilities. The MPD is looking for space to teach "new alternatives for protection". And Aikido? There may be classes taught once a week in conjunction with the martial arts program. Talks are under way.



If there has been any time, it is now that you should take the opportunity to *return* to Sunday School to learn more from scriptures in the New Testament, especially from the Book of Mark.

Dr. C. Clifton Black is the author of the Sunday School lessons that Kathy Young is bring-

ing to Central's members. The author has this to say about the Gospel of Mark, and readers of the *Banner* should take note:

"To come straight to the point. The church has canonized Mark as its Scripture along with some other ancient documents, all of which originated in a world quite different from ours and none of which was first written with us in mind. This fact in itself is important for us to remember in studying the bible: The text is not us. It does clearly mirror our understanding in all respects. Sometimes it addresses us in an alien voice. As a result, we need not jump to tithe perceptions of the biblical authors. Nor need we leap to the opposite extreme of asserting such overwhelming knowledge over the Bible that we keep it shut at all points where it offends our modern sensibilities. A more balanced and profitable alternative, I think, is the promotion of an ongoing conversation between the church and its' Scripture, a dialogue that encourages the respectful exchange of different points of view."

As an example how the study of the Gospel of Mark begins, Dr. Black starts the first lesson with scripture from chapter 1, verses 1 through 45. He asks the reader: If you were to describe the ministry of Jesus, where would you start? With the Sermon on the Mount? With His homecoming sermon in Nazareth? The existence of God before time and space as in John 1:15? No! Mark Begins by narrating Jesus' exorcism of a demon, or unclean spirit, at Capernaum. So, to learn more about the Book of Mark, you're invited to Sunday School. Room abounds for you!

The Gym Roof:

The Saga Continues!



Large equipment began to arrive early Tuesday morning, August the 10th, along with materials for the new gym roof, four huge dumpsters, and hand tools to remove the old gym roof.

The workday at Central day, however, began before dawn on Wednesday, August the 11th, for custodian John Rainey. Workers would be arriving early to begin removing the old roof so that the new gym roof could be installed. Doors had to be opened, lights in the gym turned on, and time needed to show the workers how to get to the roof.

By 7 a.m., pieces of the old roof were torn away and were lowered to the dumpsters below.




